How is this activity important to program quality?</b>	<p>Infant Toddler specialists from a variety of program initiatives offer professional development technical assistance to providers for the provision of high quality, responsive and relationship-based services to infants and toddlers. Technical assistance and professional development may be offered by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Early Intervention Technical Assistance (EITA)</li> <li>• Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation Project (ECMH)</li> <li>• Regional Keys' staff who specialize in infant-toddler services</li> <li>• PA Keys Infant-Toddler Specialists</li> <li>• Family Support Programs (NFP, PCHP, CTF, HV)</li> </ul>
<b>Description of initiative and any component parts (Technical assistance available, professional development, program assessment inventories, etc.)</b>	<p>Providers may request on-site technical assistance to support their work with families and children as well as the development of responsive classroom environments and programming. Depending on the type of requested support, the assistance may be child-specific or classroom-specific. The specialists have been trained and use a framework of support that is based on the Program for Infant and Toddler Caregivers (PITC), the Center for Social Emotional Foundations of Early Learning (CSEFEL), Mind in the Making, and Center for Early Learning Literacy (CELL). Their efforts focus on helping build strong relationships and the understanding of the impact of positive social emotional development on children's life-long learning and success. There are many professional development opportunities on the PA Key on-line calendar specific to working with families or improving practice with infants and toddlers.</p>
