Title of activity/initiative:	Program Administration Scale (PAS)
	to assess program administrative competencies
Purpose, goal and expected outcomes of the initiative. How is this activity important to program quality?	Research demonstrates that overall administrative practices in ECE programs are critical components of ensuring high quality outcomes for children. This project will measure ECE facility based leadership and management policies and implementation of those policies, and provide data for developing strategies to improve on-site administrative practices.
Description of initiative and any component parts (Technical assistance available, professional development, program assessment inventories, etc.)	Site leadership including the center director, lead teachers and others in administrative roles participates in PAS PD.
	Once trained on the appropriate use of the tool, site leadership conducts a PAS self-assessment, including review of current documents, policies and how staff is implementing policies and procedures. Using data from the assessment, site leadership will share outcomes with staff, families and governing board representatives. Group will come to consensus on three improvement goals for the facility.
	Study existing research and resources related to identified improvement goals. Determine technical assistance needs and what resources are needed to support goal achievement.
	Participate in PD sessions targeted to meeting improvement goals. Develop presentations for staff meetings related to findings. With support from regional partners, conduct visits to other programs with identified best practices in place.
	Determine additional human and financial resources need to meet goals. Use annual merit award to purchase services and products.
	Create and implement strategies, tasks and time lines for each goal. Conduct PAS post assessments in six months following full implementation of all goals.
