Family to School Connection	
	Make contact with family in first two weeks of final preschool year to assist family in
	understanding the transition to formal school setting process.
	Assess family needs and possible link with needed services (such as Early Intervention, speech or occupational therapy, etc.)
	Encourage families to establish and develop connections with other families experiencing the transition process.
	With sending teacher's participation, schedule regular family transition meetings.
	Help organize back to school nights and transition orientations with families.
	Encourage school-to-home and home-to-school learning activities.
Child t	o Child
	Promote peer to peer connections in the early learning setting.
	Encourage to families to promote peer connections outside of the early learning setting.
Child to School	
	Introduce each child to the formal school teacher and support staff (ie. Classroom aides, TSS workers, librarians, school bus driver, Principal, etc.)
School	to School
	Encourage teachers to establish and develop supports with other teachers experiencing the transition process.
	Foster inner school discussions about programs and classroom practices.
	Encourage events by sending and receiving schools.
	Initiate meetings between early care and formal school teachers about children and the transition year.
	Invite formal school staff to visit early learning setting.
	Discuss expectations for transition with formal school staff.
	With family release, discuss particular child with formal school staff.
	Practice formal school setting rituals.
	Make contact with former early learning students to help build familiarity between early
	learning and formal school setting.
School	to Community
	Help clarify community needs and expectations regarding schools and transition.
	Meet regularly with the transition team.
	Ensure partners are informed and involved with the transition team's goals and plans.
